



# LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Shire of Cranbrook ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 21 October 2023 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Cranbrook.

#### Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

#### **Enrolment Forms**

You can enrol or update your details online, or download an enrolment form, via the Western Australian Electoral Commission website (<a href="www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol">www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol</a>). Forms are also available from the Australian Electoral Commission (<a href="www.aec.gov.au">www.aec.gov.au</a>). Enrolments and updates must be completed and received by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023.

#### Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Cranbrook and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are not on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Cranbrook you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Cranbrook prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Cranbrook to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

#### Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

#### Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

#### Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Cranbrook.

# Recipe's

Lemon, ginger and coriander chicken with potatoes and slaw

Ingredients - 750g new potatoes, thickly sliced, 1 tbsp coriander seeds, Finely grated zest and juice 1 lemon, 20g ginger, finely grated, 2 tbsp olive oil, 4 chicken legs, 2 carrots, 100g radishes, 2 tbsp mayonnaise, 2 tbsp Greek yogurt,

25g coriander, roughly chopped

Method - Step 1 - Heat the oven to 200°C fan/gas 7. Spread out the sliced potatoes evenly in a large roasting dish. Crush the coriander seeds using a pestle and mortar, then

stir in the lemon zest, ginger and oil.

Step 2 - Season the chicken with salt, then coat with the oil mixture, pushing some under the skin. Sit the chicken on top of the potatoes, skin-side up, and roast for 35-40 minutes, until the potatoes are tender and the chicken has crispy skin and is cooked through.

Step 3 - Meanwhile, grate the carrots and finely slice the radishes. In a large bowl, combine the mayonnaise, yogurt and lemon juice and season well. Stir through the carrots, radishes and coriander until well combined. Serve the slaw alongside the chicken and

potatoes

HANDY TIPS - Herb stalks contain just as much flavour as the leaves (if not more) – just chop them a little finer and you can include them in your slaw or stir them into the chicken marinade. Use a mixture of chicken thighs and drumsticks rather than whole legs if you like. You can also make this dish with skin-on chicken breasts; just reduce the cooking time to 30 minutes.

Vegetables





#### **Kids in the Kitchen - Carrot Stars**



# **Cranbrook Police News August 2023**

I can't believe that Cat has been here for four months already, where does

the time go? I'm so happy that she and her family have made themselves comfortable in Cranbrook, are building friendships and enjoying life in the Great Southern.

Last week we spent a day in Kojonup participating in a combined traffic action, supported by Albany Traffic. For the day we achieved a combined total of 480 random breath tests, several speeding infringements and a drug and vehicle seizure. Days like these are a great opportunity for Cat and I to build up our traffic skills with neither of us previously having a road policing background.



Unfortunately, we are gaining significant experience attending crashes, with three separate serious crashes having occurred on the Albany Highway over the past several weeks. It is not a coincidence that all of these have occurred just south of Tunney which is referred to as a "fatigue band" for drivers heading to Albany from Perth. Please discuss this concept with your friends and family and act to avoid the results of fatigue. This could include regularly swapping drivers, not driving after a full day of work, avoiding driving when you are normally sleeping and taking regular breaks.

Aside from that we have had a busy couple of months. While Cat was on leave in July I executed three search warrants within 7 days at addresses in

Tenterden and Frankland River. Thankfully, our colleagues in Kojonup, Albany, Gnowangerup, Tambellup, Mount Barker, Albany Police Station and Albany Detectives were more than happy to come up and assist me with these jobs over the week.

Two of the warrants related to burglaries that had occurred in Tenterden, Kebaringup and Amelup in July. As a result of these warrants a female person has been charged with five counts of receiving and other drug related offences and approximately \$30 000 worth of property was recovered.

In brighter news, we will be at the Frankland River Primary School on Friday evening the 25 August 2023 for their Blue Light Disco. Hopefully all the kids have their crazy hair and outfits ready as we are looking forward to seeing everyone there.



# Voting in the October 2023 Local Government Elections

The State Government is putting into action the most significant reforms to the local government sector in 25 years. The reforms will increase the transparency, accountability and efficiency of local government in WA

One of the key reforms is the change from 'first past the post' system of voting to optional preferential voting (OPV).

This change will be introduced for the October 2023 local government elections which will now be in line with state and federal elections.

OPV will strengthen democracy by giving ratepayers a greater choice of candidates.


# Stronger local democracy

# 78 Country Libraries Receive Much-Needed Grants

The LBW Trust, in collaboration with Friends of Libraries Australia (FOLA) and Harvey Norman, are pleased to announce that 78 country libraries throughout regional, rural and remote Australia are the recipients of much-needed funding through the Trust's 2023 National Backyard Cricket (NBYC) campaign.

\$110,126 was distributed to 78 libraries (NSW 29; QLD 4; SA 13; TAS 5; VIC 8; WA 19) for projects ranging from establishing a Seed Library; holding mindfulness meditation workshops; introducing a Story Dog program; educational programs to increase digital literacy; Aboriginal cultural education events; a summer reading challenge; and a teenager led STEM Club *The Innovation Station* to run weekly at Broome Public Library in Western Australia.

Frankland River Library was one of the 78 libraries to receive a National Backyard Cricket Grant. The library received \$1500 funding which was used to purchase Stem based Lego supplies to initiate a Lego Club. "We are so grateful to receive this funding from National Backyard Cricket. It makes a huge difference for small, rural communities such as ours," said CRC Manager Teresa Lawson, who made the initial application.

"Backyard cricket holds a special place in Australia and it is wonderful to be able to combine our love of cricket with supporting country libraries" says NBYC Chair Marek Ristwej.

"Funding has been made possible by the generous donations of individuals who participated in 2022/2023 NBYC events, plus great support from retailer Harvey Norman and LBW Trust supporters. We are delighted to be able to fund all 78 applicants! We look forward to seeing their projects come to life and the difference they will make in their community."

FOLA President Jack Goodman says "Country libraries are at the heart of the community, providing havens where people of all ages and backgrounds can come together to share ideas, learn new skills and connect with each other. These grants are another example of the exceptional projects being run by Australia's under-funded and under-valued country public libraries."
