



60 Day Prescriptions

Dear Webster Patients, Safety Net Patients and Your General Practitioners,

We are writing to you regarding the Federal Government's decision to introduce the "60 Day Prescription" Policy which will come into effect on 1st September. This will allow patients to obtain prescriptions for 60 days supply for many medications rather than the currently allowed 30 days.

At face value this seems to be a great idea. However, this policy has been rushed through without deliberation or consultation with the community pharmacy industry. There will be drawbacks and negative impacts for many patients (including yourself) as well as for your local pharmacy.

COST

As a Concession card holder – your yearly spend (per couple/family) on PBS medication is capped once you reach the safety net threshold of \$262.80 per calendar year. **This is equal to 36 prescriptions per year** combined for everyone on your Medicare card (i.e. 3 scripts per month).

Once this threshold is reached, you receive all your PBS medications **FREE** until the end of the year.

Whether you get 30-day scripts or 60-day scripts this safety net amount remains unchanged. Therefore, your total yearly spend on medication remains the same even if you elect to have 60-day prescriptions. You will spend the same amount but over a longer period and will miss out on the savings provided by the PBS safety net.

Whilst there is no net saving to you — the government is funding this policy by **significantly reducing the amount of funding the pharmacy receives** from the PBS. We are effectively being asked to start supplying twice as much medication at our own expense - which is just not sustainable.

This funding cut is significant and will make it impossible for us to maintain many of the services we provide to you for free or at subsidised cost. This includes:

Free blood pressure checks
Free medication and health advice
Free blood sugar checks
Subsidised Webster Packing
Free deliveries
Free document witnessing service
Free expired & unused medicine disposal
Free used sharps disposal

We have already made the tough decision to increase the price of our Webster packing for the first time in over 20 years. Unfortunately, there are likely to be more cost increases of goods/services and the introduction of fees for these previously free services. There may also be a requirement for us to reduce staffing levels (resulting in job losses) as well as potentially reducing our trading hours.

CONFUSION

The 60-day script policy does not apply to all medications. You will still need to come back to the pharmacy every month for the medications that are still restricted to 30-days supply. You would also still be required to see your GP for prescription renewal just as frequently as you do now. We believe it remains easier and less complicated to get all your prescription and medications at the same time.

SUMMARY

We certainly understand the cost-of-living difficulties currently being faced in the community. Our industry has been advocating for years for the Government to lower the cost of medication. However, hopefully you can see that the 60-day script policy is not the correct way to do this – and that this policy is detrimental to our patients and to your local pharmacy.

It is our recommendation that if you are happy with how your prescriptions are managed now and happy with the services our pharmacy provides please politely request that your doctor continues to write your scripts for 30-days as they are currently rather than increasing them to 60 days.

We thank you for your continued support and understanding in this complicated time.

Recipe's

Easy lamb shawarma salad

Ingredients - 4 lamb leg steaks, cut into 4cm pieces. 1 tbsp Moroccan or Middle Eastern spice mix, 2 tbsp olive oil, 1 red onion, thinly sliced into rings, 1 tsp caster sugar, 2 tbsp apple cider vinegar, 250g packet microwave brown rice and quinoa, 2 Lebanese cucumbers, coarsely chopped, 1 red capsicum, deseeded, coarsely chopped, 1 cup fresh mint leaves, torn if large, 200g tub hummus, 60g feta, crumbled.

Method - Step 1 - Toss the lamb and Moroccan or Middle Eastern spice mix in a bowl until well coated. Heat half the oil on a barbecue flat plate or frying pan on mediumhigh. Cook the lamb for 2-3 minutes each side for medium or until cooked to your liking. Transfer to a bowl.

Step 2 - Meanwhile, combine the onion, sugar and vinegar in a glass or ceramic bowl. Season with salt. Set aside to pickle. Microwave the rice and quinoa mix following packet directions. Set aside to cool slightly. Place the cucumber, capsicum and mint in a separate large bowl. Toss until combined.

Step 3 - Add the onion and pickling liquid, rice and remaining oil to the salad mixture and toss. Spread the hummus over the base of each shallow serving bowl. Top with the salad mixture and lamb. Drizzle over any lamb juices. Scatter over the feta, season and serve.



Nothing nice about surprise visits

Everyone has the right to privacy in their own homes, and those living in rental properties across Western Australia are certainly no exception.

Claims of private landlords and property managers arriving unannounced for inspections, maintenance and rent collection are fairly common issues reported to Consumer Protection – in the past two years, our team has fielded 177 enquiries and 36 complaints from tenants on this front.

Tenancy laws in WA have strict procedures around when landlords and agents can access the property for reasons such as collecting rent, in the case of an emergency (like for <u>urgent repairs</u>), or for routine inspections. A maximum of four routine inspections only can be carried out per year, including for landlords who live elsewhere and want to visit the property the next time they are in the area.

In between inspections, tenants are entitled to privacy and the quiet enjoyment of their rental home. This means landlords and property agents should not be keeping tabs on them through other means, like using surveillance cameras or driving-by the property.

To arrange a routine inspection, a tenant must be given seven to 14 days' notice and be provided with a notification that sets out the mutually agreed day and time.

If this process is not carried out correctly, tenants are well within their rights to refuse entry, as it is a breach of the tenancy agreement.

Instead, tenants should state clearly that unannounced visits will not be tolerated and insist the proper process be carried out next time. There is a formal notice that tenants can issue to the owner or agent, stating a breach of the tenancy agreement has occurred as a result of the unannounced visit.

On the other hand, tenants should not unreasonably withhold permission for access to the property when proper notice has been provided, as this could put them in breach of their lease and create a risk of eviction.

It's also worth remembering that when inspection day arrives, landlords and agents should only be checking for damage, or issues that could cause damage – tenants do not need to present a property that's in the same condition as when they first moved in.

Tenants who are having problems with surprise

inspections are encouraged to lodge a complaint on the <u>Consumer Protection website</u>, email consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or call 1300 30 40 54.

Scammers target seniors with fake WA Seniors Card website

- Scammers stealing money and ID from seniors
- WA Seniors Card membership is free of charge and only available via ww.seniorscard.wa.gov.au
- Contact ID Care immediately if you gave out your
 ID or your bank if you paid a fee

Western Australian seniors are being targeted by scammers through a fake WA Seniors Card website requesting money and multiple forms of personal identification.

The fake website seniorsportal.au claims to be "officially approved" and charges WA Seniors Card applicants a fee of \$29.

The WA Seniors Card is free of charge and applicants are never requested to pay a fee, or disclose personal identification such as bank or credit card details in exchange for membership. WA Seniors Card does not accept Seniors Card applications made by third party organisations.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake is concerned for seniors that have been targeted by these cyber criminals and handed over their personal identification such as bank details, driver's licence and passport.

"If you have provided any form of ID to this fake website, make sure to contact ID Care on 1800 595 160 or visit their website www.idcare.org," Ms Blake said. "If you have already made a payment to this fake website, contact your financial institution and report that it is a fraudulent transaction. "There is only one website where a WA Seniors Card is available. Only use www.seniorscard.wa.gov.au to get your card or visit WA Seniors Card in person at Level 2, 140 William Street, Perth 6000. "Remember, any time you are looking for a WA Government service online, always make sure the website address ends in a ...wa.gov.au to confirm it is legitimate. Be aware that the first listing on an internet search may not be a legitimate website and not the service provider you are searching for."

Getting Into the Driver's Seat – It's Our Health

Empowering men to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health, that's our core focus here at The Regional Men's Health Initiative. We do this in light of the adverse statistics that represent men's health in general and the notion that for a large proportion of men developing their health knowledge is not seen as a priority. This fits with men having a more functional view of their health i.e. not seeking help until we are virtually physically impaired by the problem. We often challenge men on these points but what does it really mean as a bloke to take responsibility for his own wellbeing and health?

As blokes we take responsibility and make a lot of informed decisions throughout our lives, on a variety of things such as family, work and social issues. Why then should decisions about our wellbeing and health be any different?

Too many blokes are running into trouble because we keep avoiding and putting off looking after our wellbeing and health. Just being a passive participant is not good enough, we need to be the one in the driver's seat in all areas of our health be it physical, mental or social/spiritual.

Taking responsibility for our wellbeing and health means becoming an active and informed healthcare consumer. It means scheduling regular service visits with our doctor and being aware of issues that affect us at certain stages of our lives, such as the potential for prostate problems as we get older. We also need to consider issues that could be common in our families (hereditary) and discuss these with the doctor. It's a bit of a generalisation but how many of us guys rely on our wives or partners for our health when it comes to our diet i.e. what food is in the house and what we eat for dinner?

Remember that it's not our wife's, mate's or doctor's wellbeing and health, it's ours. Good wellbeing and health can only happen if and when we as blokes take responsibility!

While taking charge is important it doesn't mean

we have to go it alone, we all need help sometimes. From a community educator and support worker perspective, this often means our role involves walking beside someone helping to establish relevant pathways of support. It could also be simply listening to and validating people's issues and accompanying emotions. We see it as, walking beside the ute with the window down but not hopping in, it's your ride, you are the one in the driver's seat!

Our key message ... before it at all gets too much... Talk to a Mate[®]!! requires us to take some responsibility in that it's important we identify who our mates are so that when the shit hits the fan (and it does happen) we have a plan in place to address things.




