Easy Spaghetti Marinara

Ingredients - 350g spaghetti, 45g canned anchovy fillets, 4 cloves garlic crushed 1/2 tsp dried chilli flakes, 1/2 cup dry white wine (optional), 810g canned crushed tomatoes, 400g seafood marinara mix, 290g Italian style salad kit, 1/3 cup continental parsley, chopped

Method -Step 1 - Cook pasta in a saucepan of boiling, salted water according to packet instructions. Drain

Step 2 - Meanwhile, place anchovies, including oil, in a large, deep frying pan over medium-high heat for 1 minute. Add garlic and chilli, then cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant. Add wine, if using, then bring to the boil.

Step 3 - Add tomatoes and bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium and simmer, uncovered, for 5 minutes to allow flavours to infuse. Add seafood, then cook for 4 minutes or until seafood is just cooked through. Add pasta and toss to coat.

Step 4 - Meanwhile, prepare salad according to packet instructions. Scatter parsley over pasta, then serve with salad.

Thank you to all our parent volunteers who assisted on the day. Our parent volunteers are a wonderful support to our school. A special thanks Elizabeth Smith who has confidently and capably coached our students in triple jump over many years and donated her time to act as the triple jump official at both faction and interschool carnivals. We will miss Elizabeth's guidance in future years.

Thanks also to Josh Warburton for transporting the shade structures, and to Aaron Johnston and Paul Hopkinson who helped to reinforce our shade structure when the gusts of wind got quite strong!

As part of our Business Plan, and based on recommendations from our last school review, we have been working very hard to embed Aboriginal and Indigenous perspectives into our classrooms to enrich student learning. One way we do this is to access knowledge from local Elders. On Friday 13th October, Larry Blight will be running workshops for our students. Larry Blight from Kurrah Mia is a Menang man. He last visited our school in 2017 and some of our older students have previously worked with him conjunction with the Gillamii Centre. He has extensive knowledge of local bushfoods, medicines, fauna, local stories and traditions. Larry has been passing on this knowledge through cross-cultural awareness workshops, Aboriginal tourism, school educational workshops and more. Larry has helped archaeological digs and research. His passion to understand and to share not only "what", "where", and "when", but also "why", "how", add dimension and often humour as he tells stories of the Menang people and their history. Larry is experienced at making traditional tools using natural products and techniques passed down from his ancestors.

We will be walking to the bush reserve on Trent St to look at bush foods and medicine found in our local area. Families are welcome to come along and learn with us. Just remember that parents will need to sign the <u>'parent declaration form'</u> and other family members will need to have obtained a 'Working with Children Check' prior to attending.

The cost for this incursion is: \$17.50

This includes a sausage sizzle and fruit and vegetable platter lunch. If families need financial support for their children to participate in this incursion, please contact the school so we can help.

Local Government Reform

Voting in the October 2023 Local Government Elections

The State Government is putting into action the most significant reforms to the local government sector in 25 years. The reforms will increase the transparency, accountability and efficiency of local government in WA.

One of the key reforms is the change from 'first past the post' system of voting to optional preferential voting (OPV).

This change will be introduced for the October 2023 local government elections which will now be in line with state and federal elections.

OPV will strengthen democracy by giving ratepayers a greater choice of candidates.


Stronger local democracy




