Letter to the Community from the Retiring Shire President, Cr Phil Horrocks.

To the Councillors, Staff and Ratepayers of the Shire of Cranbrook,

As you would be aware, I made the decision to retire as Shire President and as a Councillor for the Shire of Cranbrook and did not nominate for election this year. In conjunction, with another long term and hardworking Councillor, Cr Peter Beech, we decided that our time was up! This also simplified the election process as we were due to reduce our Council from 9 to 7 members because of the Local Government Reforms.

I am leaving a Council that is a model that most Shires want; one with a good gender balance, as well as a much younger demographic and not all are farmers in the conventional sense. We have for example a wine grower, someone involved in the tourist industry, someone who has worked for years in the public sector and another who has been a financial administrator, a shearer, farmers who are first generation and those whose families have been in the agricultural industry for generations. They all bring different skills and experience to the role, but together they have brought positive change to the Shire of Cranbrook.

Over the last four years through a combination of grant funding and Shire revenue, we have replaced the old playground at Cranbrook, expanded with a new tourist and information bay and completed the King Street drainage in Cranbrook. To ensure the safety of road users, we were also part of the funding and project management of the Cranbrook Heavy Vehicle Rest Bay at the intersection of both Highways and continue to maintain this asset. In addition, we have built the new lookout at Sukey Hill, and this has become the most beautiful site in Australia for our Anzac Day Dawn Service.

The Shire has continued to work with the State Government and the Tenterden Tennis Club on the reconstruction and resurfacing of four tennis courts to a value of \$246,000. The project has commenced and is close to finalisation.

In the last two years we have similarly replaced the old sad playground at Frankland River with a new one, and cleared the old Skate Park site and utilised it for a modular pump track. We have completed that work with an improved car park and streetscape and will be adding dual use footpaths to connect all these new assets to the School and the Caravan Park.

When asked what I consider is my greatest achievement whilst on Council, I can only think of the new Planning Policy in relation to plantations; where it limits the percentage of good land that can be put under trees. We were a year ahead of other Shires in making this addition.

I would like to particularly thank the Executive Management Teams I have worked with over my eight years as a Councillor and as President, their assistance and commitment are very much appreciated. I also wish to thank everyone for their support within Council and outside in the Community, it has been a great journey and I have enjoyed the experience of being Shire President and wish the new Council well.



FIVE-SPICE PORK RICE PAPER ROLLS

Ingredients

1/2 carrot, cut into thin strips, 1/2 long red chilli, cut into thin strips, 1/2 Lebanese cucumber, cut into thin strips, 2 tsp caster sugar, 2 tbsp rice vinegar,50g vermicelli noodles, cooked according to packet instructions, 1 tsp five-spice powder, 2 tsp olive oil, 200g pork fillet, trimmed,1 rice paper wrapper, 1 tsp sweet chilli sauce, 1 tsp oyster sauce, 1 tbsp soy sauce, Juice of 1/2 lime, plus wedges to serve,

Mint leaves, to serve Method

Step 1-Preheat the oven to 190C. Line a baking tray with baking paper

Step 2-Combine carrot, chilli, cucumber, sugar and vinegar, then set aside for 20 minutes.

Drain, then toss with cooked noodles.

Step 3-Whisk five-spice and oil in a bowl, add pork and turn to coat. Heat a fry pan over medium heat. Cook pork, turning, for 6 minutes or until lightly charred. Transfer to the prepared baking tray and roast for 4-5 minutes until cooked through.

Step 4-Soften rice paper wrapper according to packet instructions. Combine sauces and

lime juice in a bowl.

Step 5-Top rice paper wrapper with noodle mixture and sliced pork. Serve with lime wedges, mint and sauce for dipping.

Make a Pea Trellis From Pruned Branches

During late winter or early spring, while pruning dormant shrubs and trees, gather branches about 1 inch in diameter and at least 18 inches long. These branches can be repurposed to create an attractive, cost-free pea trellis. The branches need not be straight; twisted ones work well. However, branches with lateral growth are ideal as they offer plenty of places for pea tendrils to

grip.
Push the branches securely into the soil to prevent wobbling and arrange them closely together to form a solid barrier. Trim any protruding side branches. Then, plant your pea

seeds near the trellis's base.

Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to pests, weeds and diseases

Ants in your plants, and pavers?

Want to know what your problem ants are and how to control them? You've come to the right place.

There are thousands of ant species in Australia, and most are difficult to identify without a microscope and specialist knowledge. There are very effective baits for some species, while others require control using sprays.

Other species rarely need any control and can be left alone. Unless you know the species of ant, control can be guesswork, which can waste your time and money, and involve the unnecessary use of pesticides.

By submitting samples for identification, you can learn about the species of ants at your property and how to control them, plus you'll contribute to ant surveillance in WA. Detections in recent years of exotic and problematic species such as the African black sugar ant, red imported fire ant and browsing ant, is a testament to the ability of ants to arrive in WA via freight and cargo. Their rapid detection provides the best chance of eradication and prevents the economic, social and environmental impacts caused by these ants.

For ant identification services, we request that only **dead** specimens are submitted. This will prevent any unintended spread of the ants, whilst keeping the postie happy!

Sampling instructions

- Brush ants into a sealed container, Ziplock bag or collect ants using the sticky side of transparent tape and fix this gently to a piece of paper.
- Place sample in the freezer for 1-2 hours to kill any live ants.
- Label samples with the collection location e.g. backyard, kitchen, bathroom, driveway etc., and include a note with your name, address, contact number and email address.
- Deliver or post to: Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS), Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, 3 Baron-Hay Court, South Perth WA 6151.

Any suspected exotic ant species should be reported for biosecurity screening to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.




