

Recipe's

Coconut satay chicken noodle bowl

Ingredients

450g fresh hokkien noodles, 1 lemongrass stalk (white part only), finely chopped, 2cm piece fresh ginger, peeled, finely chopped, 1 1/2 tbsp peanut oil, 4 x 150g chicken breast fillets, 2 eschalots, finely chopped, 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped, 1 long red chilli, seeded, finely chopped, plus extra sliced chilli to serve, 1/2 x 270g jar Yeo's Satay Sauce, 165ml can coconut milk, 1/2 tsp sesame oil,

1 Lebanese cucumber, peeled into ribbons, 2 tbsp chopped unsalted peanuts, to serve,

Fresh coriander sprigs, to serve

Method

Step 1-Prepare noodles following packet directions. Drain.

Step 2-Meanwhile, combine lemongrass, ginger and 2 teaspoons peanut oil in a glass or ceramic bowl. Add chicken. Rub to coat.

Step3-Heat a large frying pan over medium heat. Cook chicken for 3 to 4 minutes each side or until cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Cover to keep warm.

Step 4-Heat remaining peanut oil in pan over medium-high heat. Add eschalot, garlic and chilli. Cook for 4 minutes or until onion has softened. Add satay sauce and coconut milk. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer for 5 minutes or until slightly thickened. Remove from heat. Stir in sesame oil. Step 5-Slice chicken. Divide noodles and cucumber among 4 bowls. Top with chicken. Spoon over satay sauce. Sprinkle with peanuts, extra chilli and coriander. Serve.

It can be used as an effective pesticide for gardens. You can create a pest-repelling spray by dissolving one cup of Epsom salt in five litres of water and applying it to afflicted plants. It's particularly useful against slugs and beetles. Alternatively, sprinkling Epsom salt around the base of plants on a weekly basis not only deters pests but also enriches the soil with magnesium, improving nutrient absorption by the plants.

Community Bank Tambellup Cranbrook will be 25 years in 2024, A little history on your local Community Bank

History: Community Banking was first established in June 1998 in the Victorian towns of Minyip & Rupanyup. Small country towns were losing their banking services and an enterprising businessman, David Matthews, contacted Bendigo Bank to see if they would fill the void. Robert (Rob) Hunt, General Manager of Bendigo Bank viewed the establishment of a Bendigo Bank Branch as being too difficult however, negotiations were started to partner with the community in providing banking services. The rest is history, as Community Banking was established.

In 1998, the Tambellup Shire co-ordinated public district meetings to try and establish some form of Banking at Tambellup. Vicki Brown of Tambellup approached Jan Pope of the Cranbrook Shire to see if Cranbrook was interested in a joint venture of Banking which would be in Partnership with Bendigo Bank. They co-opted Mr Max Trenorden, MLA in the WA Court Government and he went East to approach Bendigo Bank regarding them coming to WA. The response was positive and in March, 1999, Mr Russell Jenkins, Mr Simon Cornwell and Mr David Matthews came to WA and along with Mr Trenorden visited some 20 communities who were interested in establishing Community-owned branches of Bendigo Banks in Western Australia.

Four Communities were prepared to establish a Community Bank, with Tambellup Cranbrook being a mirror of the original Community Bank in Victoria with, in fact, similar populations and farming activities.

Tambellup Cranbrook Community Bank of Bendigo Bank was now a reality.

The Steering Committee was Chaired by Mr Greg Mengler, Secretary Mrs Jan Pope, Treasurer Mrs Vicki Brown. The committee was made up of Mr Peter Jefferies, Mr Brian Taylor, Mr Campbell Taylor, Mrs Marvina Hull, Mr Adrian Bridge with attendance by Mr Simon Cornwell and Mr Russell Jenkins of Bendigo Bank. Mr Jenkins was a Director of our Board in the early stages of our Company being established before resigning and his position being filled by Mr Simon Cornwell. The Steering Committee saw the Community Banking process as an opportunity to harvest funds for our community that would have, under existing banking practices, been lost to our community.

Operating Principals of Tambellup & Cranbrook Community Bank Branch of Bendigo Bank:

The core Principal of the establishment of the Community Bank was three-fold.

- ◆ To provide the Communities of Tambellup and Cranbrook with a viable and secure Banking service.
- ◆ To return a Dividend to Shareholders who invested their funds in the business
- ◆ To return funds back to our Communities, in keeping with the ethos of Community Banking

The Community Company is managed by a Board of Directors, elected by nomination from the community on a voluntary basis, that is: Directors do not receive remuneration. (as voted at the AGM by Shareholders). The Community Company provides the premises, pays the staff and all the operating expenses of the business. Other long -established Board practices include:

- Funding provisions made for future Franchise Agreement fees.
- Repair & replacement funds being set aside each month.
- The Board votes on the Dividend payment each year in accordance with our financial situation at the time.
- Policy of supporting organisations within our Shires and supporting major projects in partnership with our Shires.
- A working relationship with the Mt Barker & Albany Community Banks to support events that covers all the regions.
- New Directors are encouraged to attend meetings before the AGM and their election to get a feel for the position.

Code of Conduct

The Frankland District Country Club Inc. pledges itself to responsible server practices and to avoid disturbing the amenity of the local area by respecting the right of neighbors and encouraging customers to do the same.

Under clause 50 of the club constitution the committee shall have full power to suspend or expel any member of the club in the event of that member behaving in a manner likely to impair or affect the enjoyment of the club by other members. The mode of suspension or expulsion is contained in clause 50 and the right of the member to appeal is also outlined in clause 50 of the Club constitution.

The constitution and rules of the club requires a member's guest to abide by the same rules as applies to members.

Any member of the public that is not a member or a guest of a member of the Club will not be allowed to be served at the bar and would be asked to leave. Membership details would be supplied to any member of the public requiring information about the qualifications to become a member under the terms of the club constitution.

The club, through its committee of management, will set and maintain dress and behavior standards. Dress standards will be clearly advertised in the bar area.

To maintain the standards as required under the terms of the constitution the club would maintain a firm stance in identifying and removing unruly behavior and drunkenness.

(a) Once a member or guest has been identified, as becoming intoxicated under the term of the licensing requirements the club staff will limit then stop service to the member. Members entering the club in an intoxicated state will not be served. (b) All persons under 18 years of age are not admitted as ordinary members and not allowed access beyond a point 2 meters from the bar. Junior members and other persons under the age of 18 years as a member of an affiliate club are allowed access to the club premises in the company of a responsible adult member from the affiliate club, as are underage children of the club.

No persons under 18 years will be served alcohol or be permitted to bring alcohol onto the licensed areas of the club. Non-members will be asked about age as well as membership status when approaching the bar. No person under the age of 18 will be admitted as an ordinary member, no person under 18 years old will be served alcohol. This is non-negotiable, non-exemption practices of the club.

The Frankland District Country Club Inc. has identified four areas of its patron care:

- The club facility we have worked with local, health and licensing authorities to build and maintain the bar and kitchen
 area to meet the standards while being able to develop core operational functions. The Club facilities will be upgraded and
 changed as members needs change, but with the full knowledge of the various licensing authorities.
- 2.) Drink driving and our members stricter policing if the road rules has impacted on the businesses of clubs, we will continually look to identify ways so that each member can happily utilise the Club facilities without risking their livelihood with excessive alcohol consumption. The promotion of food services and responsible drinking initiatives will be highlighted in club services.
- 3.) Local community The club must first look after its members and make sure we provide the services they require. The club is conscious that it is seen as a community team player, we need to be seen by our members as active in the community as a way of them being supportive of our efforts with returned business. The club will work with other businesses and its neighbors to ensure a very harmonious relationship.
- 4.) The Club provides food and snacks for its members. The club stocks and prominently displays specialised non-alcoholic drinks for sale.

The Frankland District Country Club Inc. maintains an Approved licensed manager amongst its ranks and that person is responsible for training all staff members. The club provides all recourses to easily allow staff to undertake the necessary training. The responsible server practices as set out by the director are discussed and interpreted by the approved manager with participation of all staff members on a regular basis.
