Cranbrook Police News December 2023

I came back from my long service leave to hit the ground running with a serious assault reported that occurred at the Cranbrook Caravan Park on 1 November 2023.

As a result of that incident a search warrant was executed in Cranbrook during which two 17-year-old males were arrested and subsequently charged with the following offences – Aggravated Burglary and Commit, Assault Occasioning Bodily Harm and Common Assault. It was great to have assistance from our colleagues from Gnowangerup, Albany, Mount Barker and Tambellup which enabled us to achieve a good result for the two victims of these offences. These matters are still before the Albany Court. As a result of the search warrant 5 people present at the premises were also dealt with for drug possession offences.

Cat recently investigated two other burglary offences that occurred on a date in June that related to both the Cranbrook CBH and the Martinus Rail construction site in Broomehill. As a result of her investigation a 46-yearold male from Mount Melville has received an eight-month term of imprisonment and a significant amount of stolen property recovered.

My annual drug testing blitz is underway with numerous drivers (many driving trucks) having been required to provide oral roadside samples. It's been pleasing to see that no truck drivers to date have provided a positive result with many expressing their support in relation to the testing process.

Many thanks to everyone but particularly the Parsons family for teaching me a little more about farming during the year. I'm not sure its everyone's idea of a great day to be stuck in the cabin of a harvester with me asking a million questions, so I appreciate your patience and time.

Its been a great year for us with many highlights including the Blue Light events, engagement with the seniors, the opportunity to execute numerous search warrants and lots of shifts supporting our friends in neighbouring stations.

We've had a few new faces pass through the Police Station to assist us with coverage including "PC Chinny" from Mount Barker who assisted Cat while I was on leave. Cat and I both love showing other officers our town and making some introductions to the

The Shire of Cranbrook recognises the importance to the community of the local cemeteries. HOW TO PREPARE FOR SNAKE SEASON

- Take care in bushland and grassy areas.
- Walk and/or cycle in cleared areas only, where you can see the ground.
- When bushwalking, wear long trousers and boots or other enclosed footwear that preferably cover the ankles.
- Keep a watchful eye on the ground about a metre ahead of where you are walking, and avoid entering areas of long grass, rushes and undergrowth.
- Around your home remove long grass and items lying on the ground such as corrugated iron, which may provide cover for snakes.
- Reduce mice numbers around the house
- Make your house and property less attractive to snakes. Remove any debris or woodpiles, cut back long grass and shrubbery, remove leaf litter and block any holes around the outside of your house that may look like a safe spot to hide.

Watch out for bushfire charity scams

• Devastating Mariginiup bushfire a likely target for callous scammers

• Donors urged to be wary of fake websites and bogus social media posts

• Advice to only donate via Lord Mayor's Distress Fund or licensed charities

Kind-hearted Western Australians looking to donate to the victims of the Mariginiup bushfire are being warned by Consumer Protection to be wary of scammers who may set up fake charity fundraisers.

Individuals who wish to raise funds for victims are also reminded that collecting money for a charitable purpose requires a licence, or the involvement of a licensed charity.

Consumer Protection is yet to receive any scam reports associated with the recent bushfire disaster, but Commissioner Trish Blake believes it's only a matter of time until scammers strike.

"Heartless scammers are known to capitalise on the vulnerable by pretending to raise money for individual victims or the affected community via fake websites and social media posts," Ms Blake said.

"You might also be approached by scammers via unsolicited emails and text messages, so the best advice is avoid clicking on any links received in these ways and never hand over personal information like email addresses, phone numbers or bank details to people you don't know.

"These cruel scams not only steal money from the generous donors who want to help, but they also take away much-needed funds from the victims of these disasters as well."

To help those impacted by the Mariginiup bushfire, Consumer Protection recommends making donations to the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund, which is now actively accepting donations via the official website: https://appealswa.org.au/.

"The best way to avoid being scammed and ensure your donations get to the people who need it most, is to only donate to licensed charities, which will efficiently distribute funds, or official fundraisers like the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund which responds to major issues as they occur," Ms Blake said.

"Donors should also be aware that online fundraising

platforms also charge a fee for their services, which in some cases can significantly impact on the value of your donation."

Individuals or organisations in WA collecting money or goods from the public for a charitable purpose must be licensed under the Charitable Collections Act, administered by Consumer Protection.

"Face-to-face collectors must have an identity badge or document naming the charity and WA licence number, and they need to issue a receipt containing that information. Donors should make sure that any cash collection boxes are securely sealed before putting any money directly into the box," Ms Blake said.

Consumers can check if a charity or not-for-profit organisation is licensed to collect funds from the WA public by referring to the licensed charity register on the Consumer Protection website. The Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) also maintains a public register that lists the official website and contact details for all registered charities in Australia.

Christmas plea to take care when giving to charity

As the festive season unfolds, the spirit of giving comes alive, prompting many of us

to extend a helping hand to our community through charitable donations.

Before opening your wallet to support a cause close to your heart, it's important to watch out for scams and ask questions to find out if your full donation will be passed on.

Scammers may pose as a real charity or a cause that appeals to consumers, while third-party collectors usually receive a fee for every donation they secure. Online fundraising platforms may also charge a fee for their services, which in some cases can significantly impact on the value of your donation.

Whether you're approached at your doorstep, in a shopping centre, or over the phone, ask the collector if they are from the licensed charity itself and will receive your donation in full, or through a third-party collector who will likely take a fee.

Another benefit of dealing directly with your chosen charity, rather than through third-party collectors, is you avoid exposing your personal or financial details to an additional source. Protecting your information as much as possible during this time of frequent data breaches will go a long way to stop it falling into the wrong hands.

According to national ScamWatch figures, Australians lost \$418,132 to fake charity scams, up 121 per cent on losses from 2021.

Scammers may seek to target victims via unsolicited emails, text messages and social media posts, so the best advice is to 'practice the pause', avoid clicking on any links and opt for safer methods, such as finding the charity's official website through a search engine or the charity register.

For face-to-face collections, legitimate representatives should carry an identity badge or document naming the charity and displaying the WA licence number. They must provide a receipt containing this information, and any cash collection boxes should be securely sealed.

To verify the legitimacy of a charity or not-for-profit organisation, consult the <u>licensed charity register</u> on our website at <u>www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au</u>. The Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) also maintains a <u>public register</u>, providing official websites and contact details for all registered charities in Australia.
