

Recipe's

INSTANT POT OLIVE GARDEN ZUPPA TOSCANA COPYCAT

1tbsp olive oil 500g Italian sausages, casings remo 3 cloves garlic, minced. 1 onion, diced. 1/2 tsp dried oregano 3 potatoes, chopped. 6 cups chicken broth salt and freshly ground black pepper. 1/2 bunch kale, stems removed, and leaves chopped.

Set your instant pot to high sauté setting. Add olive oil and sausage. Cook, stirring frequently, until the sausage is lightly browned, about 3-5 minutes, making sure to crumble the sausage as it cooks, drain the excess fat.

Add garlic, onion and oregano. Cook, stirring frequently, until onions have become translucent, about 2-3 minutes.

Stir in potatoes and chicken broth, season with salt and pepper, to taste.

Select manual setting, adjust pressure to high, and set time for 5 minutes. When finished cooking, quick-release pressure according to manufacturer's directions.

Stir in kale until wilted, about 1-2 minutes. Stir in the cream until heated through, about 1 minute, season with salt and pepper, to taste.

garden lips

Look after your potted plants Plants in pots - especially those in stone, concrete or terracotta pots - are susceptible to overheating. When the days are hot, try to position them in the shade or shelter them from the hot western sun. Top tip: If your plants in pots dry out to the point where water won't soak into the soil, soak the potted plant in a tub of water for around 30minutes, then stand to drain.

Don't forget your indoor plants! They are susceptible to overheating and drying out faster in the warmer months

Be sure to water them regularly to keep them happy.

Watch out for Kimberley flood scams

People in flood-affected communities in the Kimberley and generous West Australians wanting to help with donations, are being warned to be on the lookout for opportunistic scammers trying to steal money in the wake of this disaster.

Scammers are posing as legitimate registered charity - Leedal Foundation Limited - in Fitzroy Crossing, using a fake Instagram account in their name, asking donors to buy Amazon ecards.

The real Leedal Foundation Limited does not have an Instagram account but have been raising funds through their Facebook page for people who have lost their homes in Fitzroy Crossing.

Scammers are targeting people who have already donated on Leedal Foundation Limited's Facebook page, sending them a private message through the fake Instagram page, and thanking them for their donation.

When donors reply, scammers then lure potential victims in by asking if they would like to further assist by purchasing Amazon ecards to go directly to flood-affected victims.

To avoid being scammed ensure your donation goes to the intended cause, only donate to licensed charities or official fundraisers like the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund.

Scammers are also targeting people in the Kimberley, posing as their real friends by sending a Facebook message, asking if they have received their \$20,000 flood relief money yet.

On reply, the scammers send a link to a fake Facebook page using images of a Serbian politician, telling people to add him as a friend and send a message asking for the \$20,000.

If people make contact with the fake agent, this will likely result in scammers asking for personal information - such as bank account details - to steal money.

The real friend who originally messaged was likely hacked by scammers, or a new Facebook account was created in their name.

Consumers should be on the lookout for new friend requests and language used by friends and if unsure, call or text the friend to check if the message is truly from them.

If you receive a text, email, phone call or social media message from someone you don't know, it is important to practice the pause... and think, could this be a scam?

CAMPING AND COOKING FIRES

No camping or cooking fires are permitted within the Shire of Cranbrook during the Prohibited Burning Period 1 November to 14 February (Dates inclusive); During the Restricted Burning Period 1 October to 30

 a permit must be obtained from the local Fire Control Officer for all camping and cooking fires on private property; and

October and 15 February to 30 April (dates inclusive);

- B) Additional written permission must be obtained from the Local Government CEO for all camping and cooking fires located on Shire property and Council Reserves; and
- C) A camping and cooking fire is described as;
- A solid fire which is contained in a designated fire pit, or
- A solid fuel barbeque contained in a fire safe receptacle, or;
- A wood fired pizza oven

That must meet safety requirements detailed in Section 25 of the Bushfires Act 1954. A camping and cooking fire not contained by one of the above mentioned practices, are not permitted.



HOW TO PREPARE FOR SNAKE SEASON

- Take care in bushland and grassy areas.
- Walk and/or cycle in cleared areas only, where you can see the ground.
- When bushwalking, wear long trousers and boots or other enclosed footwear that preferably cover the ankles.
- Keep a watchful eye on the ground about a metre ahead of where you are walking, and avoid entering areas of long grass, rushes and undergrowth.
- Around your home remove long grass and items lying on the ground such as corrugated iron, which may provide cover for snakes.
- Reduce mice numbers around the house
- Make your house and property less attractive to snakes. Remove any debris or woodpiles, cut back long grass and shrubbery, remove leaf litter and block any holes around the outside of your house that may look like a safe spot to hide.

European wasp shown on drinks, grapes, bacon and BBQ meats.

BACKYARD BUDDIES

The annual hunt to detect and eradicate European wasps (Vespula germanica) from WA is underway!

Guard your BBQs, monitor your pet's food and check the insects you scoop from the pool! European wasps, we are looking for you!

The European wasp is a declared pest and must be reported. It has threatened to establish in WA since six nests were found and destroyed near Fremantle in 1977, but thanks to ongoing collaborative surveillance between the Department, community, local governments and business, WA has prevented their permanent establishment and spread.

Widely established across most of southern Australia, these highly adaptive scavengers hitchhike their way across the border and into WA each year.

This season is the 45th year spent competing in a sophisticated game of 'hide and seek' against this highly adaptable and destructive pest.

Most detections are made in the Perth Metro but following regional detections in the past year DPIRD has set up surveillance traps in Geraldton, Dumbleyung, Goomalling, Bunbury, Albany, and Eucla this year.

If you live in any of these locations and would like

to join the community team by adopting a surveillance trap, please search "European wasp Adopt-a-trap" online to sign up or give us a call.

Know what to look for

Unlike the widespread and similar looking black and yellow paper wasp, European wasps:

- Scavenge on human and pet food.
- Feed on fruit like grapes and stone fruit.
- Nest underground nests can grow to the size of a basketball in a single season and have a single (golf ball sized) entrance hole.
- Have completely **black antennae**.
- Do NOT dangle their legs when flying.
