

## Recipe's

## CRISPY STUFFED ZUCCHINI

#### **Ingredients**

- 4 large zucchini halved lengthwise, 2/3 cup panko breadcrumbs, 1/2 cup fresh grated parmesan cheese,
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup finely chopped parsley, 4 cloves garlic, minced, 1/4 cup melted butter, Salt and pepper

#### Method

- Step 1. Preheat oven to 200°C. Spray a baking tray or sheet with non-stick cooking oil spray. Arrange zucchini halves, cut side up, on the baking sheet. Set aside.
- Step 2. Mix together the breadcrumbs, parmesan cheese, parsley and garlic in a small bowl.
- Step 3. Pour in the melted butter, season with  $\frac{3}{4}$  teaspoon salt and  $\frac{1}{3}$  teaspoon pepper (or to taste). Mix the ingredients together until the breadcrumbs absorb the butter (about 40 seconds).
- Step 4. Spoon the mixture over each zucchini half, to evenly cover. Spray the topping with a little cooking oil spray.
- Step 5. Bake for 20 minutes in the hot oven until the crust is golden and the zucchini halves are cooked through. Grill for a further 5 minutes on medium heat to crisp the topping.

Garnish with parsley and serve as a side accompaniment to any main dish.

## garden Tips

#### Collecting Seeds from your plants.

Once your plants have flowered or finished producing, collecting the seeds is great way to save, trade with friends & be ready for the following season.

Different plants require different seed collection techniques. Wait until the flowers have faded and the seed heads have dried on the plant. For plants with large seeds, such as sunflowers, simply cut the seed heads and allow them to dry further in a cool, dry place. For smaller seeds, like those of herbs, gently shake or tap the plant to release the seeds into a container. After collecting the seeds, ensure they are thoroughly dried before storage. Airtight containers or sealed bags can help maintain seed viability by preventing moisture.

Don't forget to label!

## SHIRE OF CRANBROOK WINGEBELLUP ROAD SHARED PATHWAY PROJECT

## **Evans Street to Rocky Gully-Frankland Road**

The Shire of Cranbrook secured funding from the Department of Transport—WABN grants to upgrade the pathway connecting the Frankland River Primary School to the community recreation and business precinct. It was resolved at the October 2022 Council Meeting that an application be submitted to the DoT WABN grant funding along with a financial contribution from the Shire to be provided within the 2023/2024 budget for this project.

The project will ensure a safe route which incorporates compliant pathways and accessible crossovers to the recreational areas and service providers in Frankland River. This project was identified via the consultation of the Great Southern 2050 Regional Cycling Strategy, along with long term feedback from the local community. Initial face to face consultation with relevant businesses commenced in September 2023. From these discussions a compliant design was produced to construct the pathway with approval given from the Department of Transport. A variation to the design has since been made. This was due to the restricted space available outside Foxys necessitating the pathway to be re-routed directly across Wingebellup Road to the War Memorial. This has now been approved by the Department of Transport.

Expected commencement of the project to the Wingebellup Road pathway will be in March 2024 with a timeframe to be completed by the end of June 2024.

Landowners of driveway crossovers within the project location will be contacted directly to ensure relevant information is given, along with the timeframe of construction, this will occur once a contractor has been appointed. All reinstatements of affected crossovers have been included within the cost of project.

## **Backyard Buddies**

Your monthly guide to pests, weeds and diseases

## Eggfruit not so Eggsellent!

In a world of Solanaceous garden delights such as capsicums, tomatoes, chillies and eggplants, an unwelcome pest often goes unnoticed until harvest time: *Sceliodes cordalis*, more commonly known as the eggfruit caterpillar. This common garden grub has a craving for plants belonging to the Solanaceae family and can turn your hard-earned produce into a feast for their insatiable appetite.

#### **Biology and management**

Eggfruit caterpillars begin their journey when the small brown moth lays her tiny, white oval eggs. These eggs are predominantly laid on the stem or calyx of the developing fruit. They hatch tiny white ravenous caterpillars, which bore into the fruit through the stem or calyx. This disguises their entry point. Munching and pooing their way through the inside of the fruit, the caterpillars often turn bright pink or red in colour as they mature. Eggfruit caterpillars are particularly hard to detect as there's rarely any external signs of infestation of the fruit. These gluttonous grubs eventually chew their way out of the fruit to pupate, and later emerge as adult moths.

Controlling this pest can be challenging and requires well-timed management during all life stages. Make sure to remove any weeds from the Solanaceous family (e.g., nightshade) reduce their breeding sources in the

garden. Moths and eggs can be controlled using light traps, or by spraying insecticidal soap on the calyx. These soaps can affect the delicate wings of the adult moth, making it too slippery for her eggs to stick to the calyx, and may also desiccate the eggs. As freshly hatched caterpillars, there is a very short window for control before they enter the fruit. Target the stems and calyx with caterpillar control products. Look for ingredients such as spinosad or the biological control 'BT' (Bacillus thruigiensis). These insecticides become virtually ineffective once the caterpillars burrow into the fruit, as they are well-protected inside. If infested fruit is found, remove and discard to break their lifecycle.

#### Report your capsicum criminals!

Although eggfruit caterpillars are a well-established species, it's the small white caterpillars that may be confused with the larvae of the non-established and reportable Queensland fruit fly (Qfly). Qfly is a significant pest of over 300 fruits and vegetables.

You can report suspicious larvae in your produce to MyPestGuide or contact the Pest and Disease Information Service by sending in photos of the larvae and cut-open fruits. Report early to keep your Solanaceous garden delights safe from unwelcome feasters!

## When expectation vs reality doesn't match on Valentine's Day

Sending your loved one wilted flowers on Valentine's Day probably won't get you the reaction you were hoping for. Before you get a bunch of dead roses thrown in your face, Consumer Protection hopes there's time to explain you have rights under Australian Consumer Law (ACL).

Consumer guarantees kick in on products purchased through Australian-based stores, including online.

When a V-Day gift arrives but isn't what was advertised, such as flowers that are significantly different to the photo, or are wilted, you have a right to a remedy under the ACL, such as a refund, replacement or repair.

You also have rights if your special someone receives their gift late and you were guaranteed a V-Day delivery. In the first instance, contact the retailer and see what they can do for you. Remember – you do not have to accept a credit note as a remedy.

Guarantees also apply on products purchased through overseas traders, however it is much harder to enforce, so keep this in mind when doing your shopping.

West Aussies should continue to be vigilant to scammers when shopping online. In 2023, online shopping scams claimed 305 WA victims, who lost a combined \$631,315. To avoid being scammed, look out for social media businesses that display few or no contact details, as well as poorly edited ads with bad English. Also, don't pay for gifts through direct bank transfer, only use PayPal or credit card so you can dispute or request a reversal of charges if your gifts don't arrive.

If you're looking online for a special someone, you should be on high alert for romance scammers as Valentine's Day approaches.

Once a romance scammer has established trust, they will share elaborate stories and ask for money they say is to cover costs with illness, injury, business expenses, duty or customs fees, legal costs, family crises, or travel. Consumer Protection advises you to never share your bank account or credit card details with, or transfer money to, someone you haven't met in person.

## Cash is king... or is it?

"Businesses have to accept legal tender." It's a comment we hear a lot at Consumer Protection, so I wanted to take the opportunity to clear this up and let you know what the law says about it.

Businesses can choose which payment types they accept. It is legal for a business to specify the terms and conditions that they will supply goods and services. This includes whether they will accept cash payment.

However, you must be made aware of these terms and conditions before you make a purchase. This could be a clear sign at the register or door stating the business does not accept cash, or the staff verbally informing you that you can't pay with cash.

We know a lot of people like to pay with cash to avoid credit card surcharges. The good news is there are rules about this too. Card surcharges are permitted under the Australian Consumer Law, however the fee must only reflect what it actually costs the business to process the payment, such as bank fees or terminal costs. If a business charges a payment surcharge, it must be able to prove the costs it is based on.

If there is no other way for you to pay without incurring a surcharge, then the business must include the fee in the total cost. For example, your local café charges \$5 for a coffee, but they do not accept cash, and all card payments are surcharged. Then it is not possible for you to buy that coffee at \$5. If the surcharge is 1% then the price displayed must clearly be \$5.05 so you can easily tell how much your coffee really costs.

While the costs associated with taking card payments is obvious, there are also costs for dealing in cash. Handling cash costs businesses in time and wages.

Remember, purchasing goods or services is entering into an agreement with a seller. You do not have to agree to make the purchase if the payment methods aren't acceptable to you. But, it is legal for the business to refuse to accept cash so long as they have made this clear.




