



# Recipe

#### Gran's Green Tomato Chutney

#### **Ingredients**

2.5kg green tomatoes, roughly chopped, 1/2kg onions, finely sliced, 4tsp salt, 1L malt vinegar, 1/2kg soft light brown sugar, 250g sultanas, roughly chopped, 3tsp ground pepper

#### Method

Step 1. Finely slice your onions and washed green tomatoes, cutting out any bad bits. Add to a large bowl and stir. Add the 4 teaspoons of salt, stir again and then cover with food wrap or a large plate and leave overnight. This will draw out lots of the tomato juices and help enhance the flavours. This step can be skipped if you don't want to leave it overnight, just reduce the salt by half.

Step 2. Heat the Vinegar, Add the Sugar

Step 3. Roughly chop the sultanas then add to the simmering vinegar and sugar. Bring the whole lot to a gentle boil.

Step 4. Drain and Add the Tomatoes and Onions to the chutney and stir in well. Add the 3tspwhite pepper. Bring to a gentle boil.

Step 5. Once all the ingredients have been added they need to be boiled gently for 1.5 to 2 hours until thick and golden. The goal of this cooking time is to reduce the liquid down so the chutney's thick and to soften the tomatoes and onions until they take on the sugar and turn brown.

Time to prepare your jars to store your Chutney!

#### Maximizing Your End-of-Season Tomato Harvest

To maximize your end-of-season tomato harvest, consider ripening the remaining tomatoes for a more fruitful yield. Accelerate the ripening process by reducing watering to induce slight stress, prompting the plant to produce ripe fruit. Additionally, remove dead leaves, new flowers, and unusable fruit to redirect the plant's energy to the remaining tomatoes.

For harvesting all tomatoes, including unripe ones, opt for off-the-vine ripening for greater control. Speed up the process by storing green tomatoes in a paper bag with a ripening apple or banana. Alternatively, individually wrap unripe tomatoes in newspaper and store them in a dry, dark location.

#### Vale

#### Leonard (Lenny) Arthur Ettridge

19/12/1947 - 2/12/2023

Lenny was born the fifth of 10 children to Roma and Arthur Ettridge in Esperance where the family was on holidays from York. Shortly after, his father Arthur was awarded a grant of land in Frankland River through the War Service Land Settlement Scheme as a veteran from WWII. The family moved and established the farm as part of the wider expansion in the Bokerup area and this property named Kookaroo is still owned and operated by the Ettridge family.

His early years of education through to Year 7 was at the Frankland River Primary School where Len was a champion athlete and keen sportsman, later playing football for the Frankland River team in the district.

Len decided on a career as a shearer and it was during this time at the age of 19 while working in Mukinbudin that a short moment in time with a shooting accident left him a paraplegic, changing his life goals and aspirations.

Len spent a long period of recouperation and with the support of his family was determined to be a survivor, not letting the accident define his life. During his time at Shenton Park, Len met and became firm friends with Frank Ponter and Bill Mather-Brown who introduced him to the world of wheelchair basketball.

Len became a pioneer of wheelchair basketball in Perth, going on to represent Australia at the 1980 Paralympics held in Arnhem, Netherlands as an Australian Roller. He excelled in wheelchair basketball and athletics and represented WA in multiple State teams in both sports, also representing Australia in the 1977 FESPIC games in both sports.

In February 1972 Len married Christine Nokes and this union was blessed with a son Ben and daughter Kirsty.

Len's love of sheep work and sheep dogs, led him to a move back to Frankland to becoming a highly successful dog-breeder where after carefully researching pedigrees and tracing lineage, he started Kirbenvale Kelpie Stud on the neighbouring farm to Kookaroo, named Maybrook. Not stopping at a formula for a line of top working dogs suitable for yard and paddock, he used his immense patience to breed and train many champions which were also highly sought after for their sheep loading instincts in the cartage industry. Len quickly became the largest sheep dog breeder in the southern hemisphere with many of his champions being sold in Australia, New Zealand, United Arab Emirates,

north and south America. Winning the National Puppy Trials in Victoria was another highlight in Len's dogbreeding career. The 1990/91 wool crisis impacted heavily on his business with the reduced number of sheep dogs being needed in the industry.

After his basketball playing days, Len moved into coaching and worked with Patrick Hunt at the AIS to develop his coaching expertise. He coached many basketball teams including ten years with the WA Country U18 men's team, WA Metro U20 women, Wanneroo Wolves U20 and Division 1 champions, Willetton Tigers U20 Champions, SBL Assistant Coach Cockburn Cougars, Willetton Tigers and Mandurah Magic, Head Coach Perth Hornets NWBL (now the Perth Wheelcats), Head Coach Cockburn Cougars Men's SBL team 1994. Later introducing his son Ben to coaching wheelchair teams Len assisted him with the Perth Wheelcats from 2004 through to 2009 winning four National Championships and a World Cup gold medal.

Len was a volunteer at Capitol 101.7FM, as a long-time host of Country Crossover on Wednesday nights. During his rehabilitation time in hospital, Len had embraced his love of country music by becoming a self-taught guitarist and entertainer initially entertaining the family and later as a solo performer Lenny Dee, becoming a regular at pub and tavern venues in Perth and Katanning and the Burswood Superdome. His version of 'When the Rain Tumbles Down in July' and the classic Graeme Connors 'Let the Canefields Burn' were regulars on his repertoire. Also known to many, working as a member of the trio Three to Get ready he performed alongside Kingsley and Greg.

Never one to stand still for long, Len's work included time with the Commonwealth Employment Service and Centrecare engaged mostly working with long-time unemployed, was involved with the Paraplegic Benefit Fund dedicated to reducing the impact and incidents of spinal cord injury, spokesperson for safety delivering the message to mining companies onsite and in the boardroom that one slip, one moment can lead to a lifetime of regret and advocate for changes to the insurance legislation supporting farm accident injuries reform to name a few.

Len's mischievous side and love of practical jokes (many involving his wheelchair) leads to many fond memories amongst family and friends.

Loving husband and father, devoted grandad... to others he was coach, motivator, role-model. Life wasn't always easy, but Len was a force of nature, an inspiration to all with his courage and determination, a testament to a life well lived!

# Al scams – The new face of deception

Deepfake videos and voice impersonations are now a chilling reality. Scammers are weaponising artificial intelligence (AI) to create convincing video and audio of well-known people, work colleagues, family members or even someone you have fallen in love with online.

Consumer Protection's ScamNet is predicting the use of Al voice and video cons to be an emerging scam feature to watch out for this year. Just recently, we saw Andrew 'Twiggy' Forrest hit out at social media giant Meta for allowing the publication of a deepfake video of him spruiking a fake cryptocurrency scheme.

With the re-emergence of the 'Hi Mum' scam, ScamNet expects to see this evolve in Australia to using AI voice impersonations. It is already happening in the USA.

Technology is making it easier and cheaper for scammers to impersonate voices or create deepfake videos. All it takes is for them to harvest a social media account and use less than a minute of someone's voice to Al generate entire blocks of speech.

A few photos are all that's needed to create a realistic deepfake video. It's a timely reminder of the value of locking down your social media accounts.

When it comes to romance online, Consumer Protection's advice was to video call the person to verify they are who they say they are.

This year we're changing that advice. Arrange to meet in person and if they can't, it's a warning sign. Video calls may be manipulated by scammers with deepfake technology.

#### But what should you look out for?

When it comes to video, look out for unnatural movements of the eyes and hands, or the mouth not moving in time with the speech. The face may also lack detail, such as the teeth not looking as they should.


With audio, the voice may have unusual speech patterns, or the person may not greet you how they normally would. There could also be a lack of emotion, or they won't answer any of your questions.

Be wary of unexpected phone calls, even from people you know, as caller ID numbers can be faked.

Don't share personal identifying information such as your address, birth date or middle name.

Consumer Protection continues to urge everyone to 'practice the pause.' Tell friends or family you'll call them back to directly to verify their identity. Discuss creating a 'safe word' to say over the phone to confirm a real emergency.





# **Backyard Buddies**

Your monthly guide to pests, weeds and diseases

#### That's So Weird!



Witches' broom on Jacksonia causing red deformed growths, fasciation on Templetonia, chimera on orange rind, and phyllody on strawberry.

Plant abnormalities have intrigued gardeners and botanists alike for many years. These abnormalities sometime result in strange growths or odd variations. Causes include environmental or genetic factors, pests, and disease. Below are some common examples, and perhaps you've noticed one or two of these before?

#### Witches' broom

Witches' broom is a symptom of stress in woody plants resulting in a deformed mass of twigs and branches, which looks broom-like in appearance. Causes include insect pests, viruses, fungi, environmental factors and genetic mutations.

#### **Fasciation**

Fasciation appears as abnormal flattened, ribbon-like, crested or elaborately contorted stems or leaves. Causes include hormonal, genetic, bacterial, fungal, viral and environmental.

#### **Chimera**

Chimera is the result of a genetic mutation. The overall appearance of fruit can be changed and sections of the rind or skin can appear striped and/or green. This is often reported in citrus where the rind colour is perfectly split between yellow and orange.

Chimera leaf mutation produce variegated, misshapen, or completely white leaves. These mutations may be prized and propagated to create new varieties.

#### **Phyllody**

Phyllody is the abnormal development of the leaf tissue caused by viral infections or environmental factors resulting in an imbalance of the plant hormones. It makes leaves grow in strange places.

#### Is control or reporting necessary?

Not much can be done to prevent these oddities. Keep plants as healthy as possible to allow them to fight off pests and diseases as best they can. These weird and sometimes wonderful malformations can be a great talking point, but if you don't want them on your plants, consider removing the affected parts. Remember to disinfect gardening equipment before and after, to avoid spreading pests and diseases.


